## **Item 4**

### **Evaluation**

The annual report on evaluation, covering the period between March 2011 and February 2012, assesses the performance of the evaluation function by presenting information on evaluation coverage, compliance, quality, institutional arrangements, and the way evaluations are used. The report also presents key findings and lessons from the body of independent evaluations conducted during the reporting period. The Executive Board may wish to adopt a decision, elements of which are contained in the report.

Evaluation of the UNDP contribution to strengthening electoral systems and processes was approved as part of the programme of work of the UNDP Evaluation Office at the annual session 2011 of the Executive Board. Strengthening electoral systems and processes has been a major area of UNDP work since 1976. As credible electoral processes are indispensable to a democratic system, UNDP focuses on strengthening inclusive participation and raising the professionalism of electoral administration. This is done with the ultimate goal of deepening democracy and accelerating sustainable human development. The evaluation determines the relevance, effectiveness, efficiency and sustainability of UNDP contribution to attaining such results. It also examines the added value of UNDP support, its responsiveness to evolving demand and to the challenges inherent in the process. The evaluation provides recommendations for future UNDP strategies for work in this area. The Executive Board may wish to take note of the findings, conclusions and recommendations of the report. The evaluation will be accompanied by the UNDP management response.

The evaluation of UNDP partnership with global funds and philanthropic foundations was approved as part of the programme of work of the UNDP Evaluation Office at the second regular session 2008 of the Executive Board. Over the past decade, in seeking to expand partnership and funding options for programme countries, UNDP has engaged with a range of environment and health-related global funds as well as with philanthropic foundations. The evaluation assesses the effectiveness, efficiency and sustainability of UNDP support to the achievement of development results when activities are carried out in partnership with global funds and philanthropic foundations. It also seeks to clarify the added value to key stakeholders of partnerships with global funds and philanthropic foundations and the comparative advantages of partnering with such funding instruments. The evaluation provides recommendation on how UNDP partnerships with global funds and philanthropic foundations could be further developed. The Executive Board may wish to take note of the findings, conclusions and recommendations of the report. The evaluation will be accompanied by the UNDP management response.

## **Item 11**

### **Programming arrangements**

The programming arrangements play an integral role in helping UNDP achieve development results. They fund critical resource facilities through which regular resources are allocated to implement Executive Board-approved programme documents, which reflect individual country needs within Strategic-Plan priorities. The first review of the programming arrangements (document DP/2010/5) raised concerns with respect to increased flexibility and responsiveness on the part of UNDP to meet the demands of a dynamic spectrum of countries with diverse development challenges. In response to decision 2010/3 on the first review, a second review was undertaken (document DP/2012/3), where UNDP agreed that it was necessary to carefully and strategically consider programming arrangements in the context of its business model and three concurrent initiatives that inform and are integrally linked to it: the new strategic plan, the integrated budget, and the agenda for organizational change. In its decision 2012/1 on the second review, the Board endorsed overarching assumptions with respect to predictability and progressivity in allocating TRAC-1 resources, and UNDP presence. In follow-up to this decision, whilst UNDP has through numerous bilateral and regional consultations focused primarily on further elaboration of TRAC-1 eligibility options and allocation models, the present document elaborates on principles underlying UNDP's global strategic presence; information pertaining to programming arrangements lines other than TRAC-1, TRAC-2 and TRAC-3; the establishment of a contingency fund; the possible inclusion of UNCDF in the programming arrangements; and TRAC-1 eligibility options and TRAC-1 allocation models.

The Board may wish to adopt a decision, elements of which are contained in the report.

#### **Country programmes and related matters**

The country programmes for approval by the Board at the second regular session 2012 are as follows: Guinea, Lesotho and Sierra Leone in the Africa region; Djibouti and Jordan in the Arab States region; India, Nepal, Pacific Island countries and territories and Sri Lanka in the Asia and the Pacific region; the Republic of Moldova in the Eastern Europe and Central Asia region; Bolivia (Plurinational State of) and Costa Rica in the Latin America and the Caribbean region.

## **Item 6**

### **Evaluation**

Under this item, pursuant to decision 2009/18, the Executive Board will have before it the biennial report on evaluation. The report assesses the performance of the evaluation function at UNFPA; the quality of evaluations; and the ability of the Evaluation Branch, Division for Oversight Services, UNFPA, to address both the coverage and the quality of evaluations. The report also analyses the corporate challenges associated with evaluation gaps and addresses ways to improve the evaluation function at UNFPA. Furthermore, pursuant to decision 2009/18, the Executive Board will also have before it a review of the UNFPA evaluation policy.

The independent review was conducted by the United Nations Office of Internal Oversight Services. In addition, pursuant to decision 2009/18, the management response is provided separately on the UNFPA website. Furthermore, pursuant to decisions 2009/18 and 2010/26, the biennial evaluation plan is provided on the UNFPA website. The Executive Board may wish to adopt a decision on this item.

### **Item 7**

#### **United Nations Office for Project Services**

In its decision 2009/25 the Executive Board approved UNOPS Strategic Plan 2010-2013 (document DP/2009/36). Pursuant to Executive Board decision 2010/21 and General Assembly resolution 65/176 the Executive Director proposed to instigate a midterm review of the Strategic Plan. The review was launched with the objective to take stock of what the organization had learned and ensure the continued relevance of UNOPS strategic direction in a changing world. The review has considered the UNOPS General Assembly mandate and relevant Executive Board decisions; the UNOPS strategic framework; developments in the external environment; operational and management results achieved over the biennium; partner needs and views; and UNOPS own experiences. Based on the findings, the review aims to focus the execution of UNOPS strategy for the next 15 months and position the organization for the strategic plan 2014-2017.

The Executive Board may wish to adopt a decision, elements of which are contained in the report.

In its resolution 39/220 the General Assembly established the need for recurrent reporting of statistical data on procurement by United Nations agencies on operational activities. As of 2008 and pursuant to Executive Board decision 2007/38, the Executive Director of UNOPS has assumed the responsibility of compiling and submitting the report. The 2011 report features a supplement that examines the issue of transparency and its effects on public procurement in the context of the global move towards creating a more accountable and robust system of development cooperation. In addition, the report also features a trend analysis of United Nations procurement from developing countries and countries with economies in transition.

### **Item 8**

#### **Follow-up to UNAIDS Programme Coordinating Board meeting**

Under this item, the Executive Board will have before it a joint UNDP and UNFPA report that addresses the implementation of the decisions and recommendations of the Programme Coordinating Board (PCB) of the Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS. The report focuses on the implementation of decisions from the 29<sup>th</sup> meeting of the PCB, held in December 2011; and plans for follow-up on the decisions of the 30<sup>th</sup> meeting of the PCB, held in June 2012. The report also highlights UNDP and UNFPA contributions in responding to HIV. The Executive Board may wish to take note of the report.

### **Item 9**

#### **Financial, budgetary and administrative matters**

Pursuant to earlier Executive Board decisions, at the first regular session 2012, UNDP, UNFPA and UNICEF presented an informal timetable for the joint review of the work on cost recovery, as well as a mock integrated budget, which called for a formal consideration at the second regular session 2012. The present report focuses on the joint cost-recovery review. The mock integrated budget will be presented separately as an informal document. The joint review has led to a number of important conclusions. Special attention is drawn to the proposal to replace the current cost-recovery methodology, which is based in part on indirect fixed costs funded solely from core resources, and the approach discussed in the report, which includes the elimination of the distinction between indirect fixed costs and indirect variable costs. In view of the above, further guidance is requested from the Executive Board, especially with respect to the final cost recovery rate(s) to be adopted during the 2014-2017 period. Accordingly, the agencies propose to present an update to the present document, including proposed cost-recovery rates, for consideration by the Board at the first regular session 2013. The Executive Board may wish to adopt a decision, elements of which are contained in the report.
