UNOPS to work with the World Bank to reduce pollution in the Black Sea

New project will help improve conditions in the Black Sea, in partnership with the Republic of Moldova, Georgia, Türkiye and Ukraine.

UNOPS will sign a new project with the World Bank, funded by the Global Environment Fund (GEF), to reduce pollution in the Black Sea. As part of this multi-national project, UNOPS will work in partnership with the Republic of Moldova, Georgia, Türkiye and Ukraine.

The project will help develop policy and investment recommendations, enhancing access to financial investment, and fostering innovation and technology in pollution management. A standout feature is the "Eco-Innovation Challenge," designed to identify and support pilot concepts through grants and an acceleration program.
