UNOPS and Lao PDR's Ministry of Public Works and Transport Partner to Strengthen National Infrastructure and Sustainable Development

VIENTIANE, LAO PDR, 20th October 2025 – The United Nations Office for Project Services (UNOPS) and the Ministry of Public Works and Transport (MPWT) of the Lao People's Democratic Republic today signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to enhance collaboration on developing sustainable, resilient, and inclusive national infrastructure.

The partnership directly supports Lao PDR's 9th National Socio-Economic Development Plan and the nation's goal of graduating from Least Developed Country status. It formalizes a framework for UNOPS, an organization with a core mandate in sustainable infrastructure, procurement, and project management, to provide specialized technical assistance and capacity-building support. This aligns with the Ministry's mission to improve the infrastructure that is vital for economic growth and the well-being of its citizens.

The collaboration will focus on several key areas. This includes improving priority infrastructure projects by providing technical and implementation support for feasibility studies, design, quality control, and contract management. The partnership will also strengthen the Ministry's capacity to plan, manage, and finance public infrastructure projects. Furthermore, it will assist in preparing Public-Private Partnership (PPP) projects to attract investment and will enhance public procurement systems by providing end-to-end support to ensure value for money, transparency, and accountability.
